Village court to ensure justice to poor: Shawkat

The deputy speaker, Shawkat Ali, has stressed the need for strengthening and expanding village court across the country in order to help establish good governance and justice to poor, underprivileged villagers..

‘There is no alternative to establishment of good governance to ensure justice,’ he said while addressing a function on ‘National Consultation on the Village Court Act, 2006: Challenges and Way Forward’, organised by the Local Government Division in collaboration with European Union and UNDP in the city on Saturday.

‘It’s not possible to establish justice in the society unless equal rights and respect are ensured for poor, underprivileged people living in villages,’ said Khawkat Ali. Justice is the fundamental right of each citizen and the constitution of Bangladesh had ensured the rights of getting justice for each citizen.

Shawkat Ali said village courts had created opportunities for the country’s poor and underprivileged people including women and children to get justice. And the village court can ensure this.
